Student Achievements:

This is a key life skill, everyone can get angry sometimes and we can all sometimes regret what we say or do in the heat of the moment so these techniques will hopefully help our students, not just in school, but for the rest of their lives.

Please assist your child in packing their bag the night before to ensure they have all required items for the next day, including a fully equipped pencil case, homework and PE kit etc. This helps them be prepared and reduces stress in the morning and again is another further key-life skill.

Holocaust Memorial Day:

Two students attended Auschwitz as part of Holocaust Memorial Day. It was a moving experience, and they will now work to increase awareness of the Holocaust at school. This is an important part of our commitment to teaching kindness, tolerance and respect for all.

Searching:

This week there was the tragic news in the press about a student who was stabbed to death in a school in Sheffield. This follows an incident that occurred last year in Wales where a child stabbed two teachers and a child in a school. This is a reminder for parents and carers that the ability to search a child who may be suspected of being in possession of a banned item is one of the key strategies that schools have to ensure the safety of students and staff. UK schools do not need parental permission or the permission from the student to conduct a search and school do not need to wait for a parent to arrive to school to authorise it or witness it. As a school, we follow the department for education guidance on searching screening and confiscation and if we suspect a child is in possession of a prohibited item, I will authorise a search immediately as Headteacher. Thank you for your support.

Responding to Parental Calls and Emails:

We aim to respond to calls and emails as quickly as possible. However, please be patient as staff may be teaching or in meetings, and we have experienced high levels of staff absence due to illness. Your understanding is greatly appreciated.

Parking:

Please park considerately in the local community near to the school site and avoid parking on zig-zag lines. This ensures the safety of all our students.

Higham Lane North Academy (HLNA):

As you know, we are part of a Multi Academy Trust (MAT) called the Central England Academy Trust (CEAT) and we were delighted to be awarded the contract to open a brand-new school called Higham Lane North Academy (HLNA) just up the road on Higham Lane. Mrs Robinson, who was Deputy Headteacher at HLS will be the new Headteacher at the new school. The two schools have been working closely together in our recruitment strategy to benefit both schools and I am delighted to state that we have made some fantastic appointments for next year!

Ofsted:

The government has released some information on what the knew Ofsted report card will look like that will replace the current Ofsted inspection framework. In my professional opinion, there are some improvements that will be better than the old system. However, I, along with the trade unions, and many educationalists, am disappointed and I personally feel that this is an opportunity missed. The current inspection framework puts enormous amounts of pressure on school staff and of course we all saw in the press the tragic death of the headteacher Ruth Perry following an inspection. The report that is produced at the end of an inspection at present gives parents limited information about the school and little information is shared with the school about how to improve further other than a small number of bullet points at the end of the document. The new framework appears to do very little to improve the lives of staff in schools and now there will be five judgements rather than four in each of the areas so many educationalists struggle to see how this will reduce the stress that is caused by an inspection that only lasts less than two days but counts for so much for schools. It is also quite possible that the new report card will not necessarily give schools any greater depth of information than it did before in terms of how to improve. We hope that the government will take on board the feedback from the trade unions and will make significant amendments to the proposals. We will keep you posted when we know more.



Marathon Fundraising:

In April Science's Mr Parker will be running not one but two marathons in one month. Brighton Marathon on the 6th April and London Marathon on the 27th April. He is raising money for Young Lives Vs Cancer who are massively supporting one of our former students and their whole family during an ongoing with cancer fight.
