Watling Meadows Primary School

It's been an exciting time for our Trust, progressing our plans to open a brand-new primary school in September 2026. We worked with the local community to name the school (Watling Meadows Primary), we've been busy choosing uniform, setting up a brand-new website, ordering amazing resources and delivering a number of events for our prospective families. We are also excited to share the news that Darren Barrow has been appointed as the school's Headteacher. This month we also attended the Groundbreaking Event where we enjoyed seeing the site and receiving an update on progress so

Contingency Plan - we have been informed that, whilst works are progressing well, the school building will not be ready in time for September 2026. The plan is therefore that Watling Meadows will still open to Reception students, however this will be temporarily on the Higham Lane North Academy site – most likely for the autumn term – whilst works are completed. Warwickshire are working with us to set up a specialist early years space that will enable us to ensure that students from the two schools are kept separate at all times whilst both benefiting from use of the site.





Fundraising

During a conversation at school, Joseph (a year 5 pupil at Michael Drayton), learned that cancer patients have to contribute £80.15 towards their temporary wig – he decided that he wanted to do something to help. Through his Mum's workplace, boxes of sweets were donated for him to sell at school. A Just Giving page was also created, which alone raised £242. Well done Joseph!





A group of Higham Lane North Academy students invited members of staff from across the Trust to attend their Coffee & Cake sale. We were really impressed by their confidence in helping organise and host the event in the Specialist Resource Provision.

Staff at Higham Lane School have been fundraising to create a Therapy Garden in the school grounds to be accessed by staff and students as a quiet place to reflect and to support students with mental health or SEND needs. The space will become a key part of the school's pastoral provision.



Expansion Projects

Oak Wood Primary School's building work is well underway for the addition of new classrooms and specialist spaces for students. The work will be completed by the start of next academic year.

Oak Wood Secondary School was due to open its offsite post-16 provision this year, however due to building work delays it will not open now until next academic year. This remains an exciting project for the school, alongside its plans to develop outdoor spaces and learning for students as part of 'Project Playground.'

Christmas Performances

All of our schools have held wonderful events in the run up to Christmas, and the students have been fantastic and a credit to their schools. I have been privileged to attend at least one at each school: Higham Lane's Christmas Concert, Higham Lane North's Christmas Spectacular, Michael Drayton's Christmas Music Concert, Oak Wood Primary's Communication at Christmas and Oak Wood Secondary's Carol Concert at Holy Trinity Church. These events have got us all in the mood for the festive season!
